## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

### Results of Operations

For the six-month period ended June 30, 2023, the NBI Jarislowsky Fraser Select Balanced Fund's Advisor Series units returned 10.04% compared to 6.16% for the Fund's blended benchmark. The broad-based indices, the Morningstar® Canada Liquid Bond Index (CAD) and the Morningstar® Canada Large-Mid Index (CAD), returned 2.48% and 6.00% respectively. Unlike the indices, the Fund's performance is calculated after fees and expenses. Please see the *Past Performance* section for the returns of all of the Fund's series, which may vary mainly because of fees and expenses.

Certain series of the Fund, as applicable, may make distributions at a rate determined by the manager. This rate may change from time to time. If the aggregate amount of distributions in such series exceeds the portion of net income and net realized capital gains allocated to such series, the excess will constitute a return of capital. The manager does not believe that the return of capital distributions made by such series of the Fund have a meaningful impact on the Fund's ability to implement its investment strategy or to fulfill its investment objective.

The Fund's net asset value rose by 6.90% over the period, from \$113.08 million as at December 31, 2022 to \$120.88 million as at June 30, 2023.

Financial markets put aside concerns over growth, inflation, and US regional banks in the quarter, generating strong returns in most equity markets.

Canadian GDP was flat in April, but it is expected to reach an annualized pace of 1.4% for the second quarter, while inflation slowed to its weakest pace in two years, rising to 3.4% in May, year-over-year, to match expectations.

In Canada, the provincial and corporate sectors broadly outperformed federal bonds, due in part to somewhat attractive valuations and a growing sense that inflation could moderate without the need for a recession.

In this context, the fund outperformed the benchmark for the period. Stock selection and overweight position in the Industrial sector and in the Information Technology sector contributed positively to the performance. Detractors to performance included our stock selection in the Materials and Real Estate sector.

The top individual contributors to performance for the period were Shopify Inc, Microsoft Corporation, and LVMH Moët Hennessey Louis Vuitton. The top individual detractors to performance for the period were Bank of Nova Scotia, TC Energy Corp, and Chubb Limited

### Recent Developments

For the past year, the portfolio manager exited our positions in Verisk Analytics Inc., and Chubb Limited. The Fund manager initiated new positions in Definity Financial Corp, Tourmaline Oil Corporation, and TC Energy Corp.

Compared to the index, the Fund is most notably overweight in the Information Technology, Consumer Discretionary, and Health Care sectors, and is most underweight in the Energy Sector and Financials.

The persistence of recession calls from financial indicators stands in contrast to the real economic indicators which have been slowing but remain at relatively strong levels. Financial markets may be faced with a weaker economic growth environment, which would negatively impact earnings growth, but the portfolio manager expects the positive influence of declining inflation to outweigh the negative influence of slower growth. Given the anticipated slower economic backdrop, the importance of careful security selection is paramount to a successful investment portfolio.

On May 1, 2023, the Fund's independent review committee (the "IRC") was increased to four members when Stéphanie Raymond-Bougie was appointed as IRsC member.

## Related Party Transactions

National Bank of Canada ("the Bank") and its affiliated companies' roles and responsibilities related to the Fund are as follows:

### Fund Manager

The Fund is managed by National Bank Investments Inc. ("NBII"), which is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank. Therefore, NBII provides or ensures the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund's current operations, including investment consulting, the arrangement of brokerage contracts for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, bookkeeping and other administrative services required by the Fund.

The Fund reimbursed NBI for operating expenses, at cost, incurred in administering the Fund, including trustee, recordkeeping, custodial, legal, audit, investor servicing, and securityholder reporting fees.

As described under the heading *Management Fees*, the Fund pays annual management fees to NBI as consideration for its services.

### Distribution and Dealer Compensation

Fund securities are offered by National Bank Direct Brokerage (a division of National Bank Financial Inc., an indirect wholly owned subsidiary of the Bank), CABN Investments (a division of NBII), National Bank Financial Inc. and other affiliated entities. Each month, brokers receive a commission representing a percentage of the average daily value of the securities held by their clients.

### Brokerage Fees

The Fund may pay broker's commissions at market rates to a corporation affiliated with NBII. The brokerage fees paid by the Fund for the period are as follows:

### Registered Plan Trust Services

NTC receives a fixed amount per registered account for services provided as trustee for registered plans.

### Administrative and Operating Services

The provision of certain services was delegated by the Fund manager, NBII, to National Bank Trust Inc. ("NBT"), a wholly-owned indirect subsidiary of the Bank. These include accounting, reporting and portfolio valuation services. The fees incurred for these services are paid to NBT by the Fund manager.

## Management Fees

The Fund pays annual management fees to the Fund manager for its management services. The fees are calculated based on a percentage of the Fund's daily net asset value before applicable taxes and are paid on a monthly basis. Under the *Distribution* heading, expenses include the broker's compensation consisting of the maximum annual trailer fees and sales commissions paid to brokers. Under the *Other* heading, the fees relate mainly to investment management, investment advisory services, general administration and profit. The breakdown of major services provided in consideration of the management fees, expressed as an approximate percentage of the management fees is as follows:

## Past Performance
