Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

The NBI Canadian Preferred Equity Private Portfolio's investment objective is to provide dividend income while focusing on capital preservation. This Fund invests directly, or through investments in securities of other mutual funds, in a portfolio mainly composed of preferred shares of Canadian companies and other income generating Canadian equities.

The portfolio manager conducts fundamental research, but will also consider quantitative and technical factors. The portfolio securities selection is based on knowledge of the company, its industry and its growth prospects. An extensive credit analysis for each security and an assessment of the risk profiles, the relative performance and the general conditions are completed in order to confirm the selection and the relative weight of each portfolio security. It is expected that investments in foreign securities will not exceed approximately 30% of the Fund's assets.

Results of Operations

For the twelve-month period ended December 31, 2023, the NBI Canadian Preferred Equity Private Portfolio's Series F units returned 6.95% compared to 5.90% for the Fund's benchmark, the S&P/TSX Preferred Share Index (CAD). Unlike the benchmark, the Fund's performance is calculated after fees and expenses. Please see the *Past Performance* section for the returns of all of the Fund's series, which may vary mainly because of fees and expenses.

Certain series of the Fund, as applicable, may make distributions at a rate determined by the manager. This rate may change from time to time. If the aggregate amount of distributions in such series exceeds the portion of net income and net realized capital gains allocated to such series, the excess will constitute a return of capital. The manager does not believe that the return of capital distributions made by such series of the Fund have a meaningful impact on the Fund's ability to implement its investment strategy or to fulfill its investment objective.

The Fund's net asset value dropped by 13.57% over the period, from \$175.72 million as at December 31, 2022 to \$151.88 million as at December 31, 2023.

The decrease stemmed mainly from a rebalancing of the managed solutions offered by NBI.

The new year got off to a roaring start on rising hopes for a soft landing for developed economies as inflationary pressures showed signs of abating and the Federal Reserve downshifted their pace of tightening. Hopes for an imminent end to rate hikes and a dovish policy pivot were dashed in the wake of unrelenting signs of resilient growth, an overheated labour market, sticky inflation, and some hawkish central bank rhetoric that prompted a shift in investor expectations towards higher interest rates for longer. The Bank of Canada increased its target for the overnight rate in January by 25 basis points to 4.50%.

The Canadian preferred share market started the year off on a volatile note. While fund flows during the first quarter were relatively supportive for preferred shares, the situation became more challenging during the second quarter (particularly in May) as investors were reluctant to add exposure to the asset class due to the potential dividend tax change for corporations that could occurred later in 2023. The market continued to be challenging as we entered the second half of the year as the negative flow of funds from both institutional and retail investors put pressure on price. The negative performance of the equity markets didn't help, despite the stable credit tone. Tone improved in September with interest rates increasing substantially and because TD Bank decided to redeem one preferred share issue. Despite continued volatility, the fund ended the year on a solid note following decision by the Federal government to not change the tax treatment on preferred share dividends only, which helped the asset class. Some surprise redemptions and the perception that Central Banks were done hiking rate and could consider cutting rate soon also contributed positively.

Over the year, the Fund outperformed its benchmark. The Fund's fixed-floating segment was the largest contributor to the performance over the year. The Fund's underweight to perpetual issues was also a strong contributor. Security selection within the energy and real estate segments was also positive. On the other hand, the Fund's security selection and underweight in banks proved to be a detractor.

Recent Developments

Over the first half of the year, the portfolio manager slightly increased his position in floating rate issues. He increased the Fund's allocation into banks and reduced the allocation to energy issuers slightly.

In terms of new issues, he bought the new institutional preferred share of BMO and the new LRCN of Intact Financial at attractive coupon and reset level. He also bought the new hybrid of Enbridge and the new hybrid of Gibson Energy at attractive coupon and reset level.

Major central banks are now likely finished hiking interest rates for this cycle. Monetary policy is restrictive and will lead to softer growth in 2024. The U.S. economy should operate below potential, but the portfolio manager now expects Canada to enter a shallow recession. Inflation has declined from very elevated levels over the past year and if it continues to fall the Bank will become more confident in hitting their two percent inflation target, which will allow them to eventually begin the process of loosening monetary policy. The market is expecting multiple rates cuts in 2024 which will provide support in avoiding a hard landing in the economy. During the year, interest rates and credit spreads are expected to stay low, but he should see volatility and opportunities as central banks transition to interest rate cuts, elevated bond supply and geopolitical risks. While recent data has shown improvements on the inflation front, more work still needs to be done to support central banks changing policy. He expects the Bank of Canada and the Fed to lower interest rates in the range of 75 to 125 basis points in 2024.

Investment grade credit spreads are still historically wide despite the recent performance. He will remain active in this sector as opportunities present themselves. He has been focused on sectors that provide more compensation or are better positioned to weather a shallow recession. His trades over the last several months have generally been defensive in nature as he has moved up in credit quality and bought shorter dated securities. The yield carry from our overweight in credit has increased to 23 basis points from 18 basis points.

On May 1, 2023, the Fund's independent review committee (the "IRC") was increased to four members when Stéphanie Raymond-Bougie was appointed as IRC member.

The Series O was launched for the Fund on May 29, 2023.

Effective on or about August 4, 2023, the Fund was closed to subscriptions and will no longer be available for purchase by new or existing unitholders, including purchases made through a preauthorized purchase plan.

NBI was informed that a substantial portion of the Fund's units will be redeemed progressively in the coming months. The portfolio subadvisor, Fiera Capital Corporation, will carry out a progressive and orderly liquidation of the Fund's assets over this period in order to meet redemption requests. While care will be given to remain invested in accordance with the Fund's investment objective and strategies, the preferred equity market presents unique challenges. As such, the Fund's portfolio sub-advisor may, from time to time, depart from the investment objective and strategies stated in the Fund's prospectus. During the liquidation period, NBI will assess whether the Fund should ultimately, in the best interest of its unitholders, be terminated or merged with another NBI Fund, depending on market conditions.

Related Party Transactions

National Bank of Canada ("the Bank") and its affiliated companies' roles and responsibilities related to the Fund are as follows:

Trustee

National Bank Trust Inc. ("NBT"), a wholly-owned indirect subsidiary of the Bank, is the Fund's trustee. In this capacity, it is the legal owner of the Fund's investments.

Custodian and Registrar

Natcan Trust Company ("NTC") acts as registrar for the Fund's securities and the names of securityholders. NTC also acts as the Fund's custodian. The fees for NTC's custodial services are based on the standard rates in effect at NTC.

Agent for securities lending transactions

NTC acts as the agent for securities lending transactions acts on behalf of the Fund in administering securities lending transactions entered into by the Fund. NTC is an affiliate of the Manager.

Fund Manager

The Fund is managed by National Bank Investments Inc. ("NBII"), which is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank. Therefore, NBII provides or ensures the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund's current operations, including investment consulting, the arrangement of brokerage contracts for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, bookkeeping and other administrative services required by the Fund.

The Manager pays the operating expenses of the Fund other than its "Fund costs" (defined below) (the "variable operating expenses"), in exchange for the Fund's payment to the Manager of annual fixed-rate administration fees with respect to each series of the Fund.

The administration fees are equal to a specified percentage of the net asset value of each series of the Fund, calculated and paid in the same manner as the Fund's management fees. The variable operating expenses payable by the Manager include, but are not limited to: transfer agency and recordkeeping costs; custodial costs; accounting and valuation fees; audit fees and legal fees; costs of preparing and distributing financial reports, simplified prospectuses, annual information forms, Fund Facts, continuous disclosure material and other securityholder communications; and costs of trustee services relating to registered tax plans, as applicable.

In addition to administration fees, the Fund shall also pay certain Fund costs, namely: taxes (including, but not limited to, GST/HST and income taxes); costs of compliance with any changes to existing governmental or regulatory requirements introduced after August 1, 2013; costs of compliance with any new governmental or regulatory requirements, including any new fees introduced after August 1, 2013; interest and borrowing costs; costs related to external services that were not commonly charged in the Canadian mutual fund industry as at August 1, 2013; Independent Review Committee costs, including compensation paid to IRC members, travel expenses, insurance premiums and costs associated with their continuing education; and variable operating expenses incurred outside of the normal course of business of the Fund.

The Manager may, from time to time and at its sole discretion, decide to absorb a portion of a series' management fees, administration fees or Fund costs

As described under the heading *Management Fees*, the Fund pays annual management fees to NBII as consideration for its services.

Portfolio Manager

The Manager has appointed National Bank Trust Inc. ("NBT"), an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank, as the portfolio manager for the Fund. A flat fee is payable annually to NBT for its management services.

Distribution and Dealer Compensation

National Bank Financial Inc. ("NBF") acts as principal distributor for the Advisor Series, Series F, Series F5 or Series T5 of the Fund. NBF may receive, depending on the distributed series, a monthly commission representing a percentage of the average daily value of the securities held by its clients.

NBII acts as principal distributor for the Series N and Series NR of the Fund. Trailing commissions are covered by NBI Private Wealth Management's service fees, which are paid directly by investors.

Brokerage Fees

The Fund may pay broker's commissions at market rates to a corporation affiliated with NBII. The brokerage fees paid by the Fund for the period are as follows:

Holdings

As at December 31, 2023, National Bank Investments Inc. held 242.62 Fund securities for a value of \$2,257.09, which represented close to 0.0017% of the net asset value of the Fund at that date. Transactions between National Bank Investments Inc. and the Fund were carried out in the normal course of business and at the Fund's net asset value as at the transaction date.

Independent Review Committee Approvals and Recommendations

The Fund followed the standing instructions of its Independent Review Committee with respect to one or more of the following transactions:

- a) Purchasing or holding the securities of a related issuer, in particular, those of National Bank of Canada;
- Investing in the securities of an issuer when an entity related to the manager acts as an underwriter for the placement or at any time during the 6o-day period after the end of the placement;
- Purchasing or selling securities to another investment Fund managed by the manager or a company in the same group;
- d) Purchasing or selling debt securities on the secondary market, through related brokers that are main brokers in the Canadian debt securities market (in accordance with an exemption received from the Canadian Securities Administrators);
- Entering into foreign exchange transactions (including both spot transactions and forward transactions) with National Bank of Canada.

The Manager has implemented policies and procedures to make sure that the conditions applicable to each of the above transactions are met. The applicable standing instructions require that these transactions be carried out in accordance with NBII policies, which specify, in particular, that investment decisions pertaining to these related party transactions must be made free from any influence by an entity related to NBII and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to NBII. Furthermore, the investment decisions must represent the business judgment of the securities advisor, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interest of the Fund and must achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

Registered Plan Trust Services

NBT receives a fixed amount per registered account for services provided as trustee for registered plans.

Administrative and Operating Services

The provision of certain services was delegated by the Fund Manager, NBII, to National Bank Trust Inc. ("NBT"), a wholly-owned indirect subsidiary of the Bank. These include accounting, reporting and portfolio valuation services. The fees incurred for these services are paid to NBT by the Fund manager.

Management Fees

The Fund pays annual management fees to the Fund manager for its management services. The fees are calculated based on a percentage of the Fund's daily net asset value before applicable taxes and are paid on a monthly basis. Under the *Distribution* heading, expenses include the broker's compensation consisting of the maximum annual trailer fees and sales commissions paid to brokers. Under the *Other* heading, the fees relate mainly to investment management, investment advisory services, general administration and profit.

The management fees paid by the Fund only cover management of fund investments, i.e. the fees related to management of fund portfolios constituting the profiles of the NBI Private Wealth Management service ("PWM"). General administration services, trailer fees and sale commissions paid to brokers are covered by the PWM's service fees, which are paid directly by investors. The breakdown of major services provided in consideration of the management fees, expressed as an approximate percentage of the management fees is as follows:

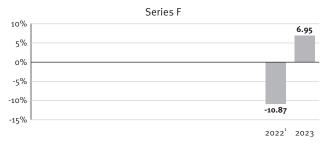

Past Performance
