Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

For the six-month period ended June 30, 2024, the NBI Liquid Alternatives ETF's units returned 4.18% compared to 2.55% for the ETF's benchmark, the FTSE Canada T Bill 91 Days Index. Unlike the benchmark, the ETF's performance is calculated after fees and expenses. Please see the *Past Performance* section for the ETF's returns, which may vary mainly because of fees and expenses.

The Fund's net asset value rose by 5.40% over the period, from \$402.56 million as at December 31, 2023 to \$424.29 million as at June 30, 2024.

The first half of 2024 was characterized by a bull market for stocks, with marked outperformance by the S&P 500 driven by technology giants which sparked optimism regarding advances in artificial intelligence. On the other hand, the period proved less buoyant for bonds which ended little changed.

Specifically, U.S. equities (S&P 500) posted a total return of +15.3% over the period, a performance largely attributable to technology stocks (Technology, +28.2%. Communication Services, +26.7%). Internationally, emerging markets rebounded (+7.7%), while the EAFE developed countries equity index grew by 5.7%, a similar performance to that of Canadian equities, with the S&P/TSX up by 6.1%.

Within fixed income, inflation volatility has proven constraining for the asset class, with markets revising downward their outlook for interest rate cuts by the influential U.S. Federal Reserve. Thus, after a more difficult start to the year, Canadian bonds finally recovered thanks to a first rate cut by the Bank of Canada, ending the half-year almost unchanged (-0.3%).

Among commodities, oil experienced a rebound in recent months with a price increase of 15.2% for the WTI, while gold was volatile but also ended the first half higher (+12.6% in USD). Finally, on the currency side, the U.S. dollar appreciated against the Canadian dollar (+3.3% for the CAD/USD) and the euro (-3% for the DXY) driven by a Federal Reserve that is increasingly on its own with a monetary policy that has yet to be eased.

In this context, the Fund outperformed its benchmark.

In the first half of 2024, NALT's three biggest return contributors were the Japanese Yen, Gold, and Copper futures positions, while its three biggest return detractors were the U.S. Long Bonds, Natural Gas, and Wheat futures positions.

In the first quarter, the three biggest contributors were the Japanese Yen, Gold, and Brent Crude futures positions, while the three biggest detractors were the Copper, Australian Dollar, and Silver futures positions.

In the second quarter, the three biggest contributors were the Japanese Yen, Copper, and Gold futures positions, while the three biggest detractors were Natural Gas, U.S. Long Bonds, and Gasoline futures positions.

Recent Developments

NALT follows a quantitative approach to determine the weekly portfolio weights. Transactions are thus applied systematically every week. Below are some of the major changes over the 6-month period.

The most notable change in positioning was in the Fixed Income asset class. The strategy on the 2-year, 5-year, and 10-year bond futures went from a long position in the first quarter to a short position in the second quarter. The strategy kept a long position in the U.S. Long Bond futures throughout the 6-month period, which was the biggest detractor of value over the semester.

As of 2024-06-30, NALT had short positions in Fixed Income (except for the SOFR and U.S. Long Bond futures), long positions in the GBP and AUD and short positions in the CAD and YEN, long positions in Energy (except for Natural Gas futures), a mix of marginal long and short positions in Agriculture futures (less than 2% in any single futures contract), and long positions in Metals. The effective duration of the portfolio was -0.065.

Since the start of the year, economic news has generally been better than expected, with, among other things, a recovery in global manufacturing activity and sustained consumer spending in the United States. And while the fog is still dense on the inflation front, the latest news has been more encouraging, prompting the Bank of Canada to cut its benchmark interest rate for the first time since 2020, and the Federal Reserve to maintain its intention to do the same later in the year.

Consequently, with inflation closing in on the landing strip, the next 6 to 12 months are likely to be a moment of truth in terms of the U.S. economy's ability to continue to demonstrate such resilience. As such, we'll need to keep a close eye on the evolution of consumer spending and, ultimately, the resilience of the job market, which could be challenged later this year. Nevertheless, in the shorter term, the fact that the Fed Chairman is keeping the door open to rate cuts could continue to generate optimism in the stock markets for a few months yet. Moreover, it suggests that the Fed will not hesitate to act quickly—as it did last year during the regional bank debacle—in the event of a significant deterioration in economic activity, thereby reducing the risk of a financial accident.

That being said, it is important to note that NALT's underlying models are purely quantitative. These models try to capture market trends to favourably direct weekly allocations. It is thus hard to predict the ETF's strategy for the coming months as well as any infrequent punctual discretionary decisions. Nonetheless, the strategy is strictly bound to respect diverse constraints which keep it in line with NALT's three main objectives: a sustained absolute positive performance, a moderate volatility, and a decorrelation to equity markets.

The Fund's risk level was modified from "medium" to "low to medium" during the year. This change aims to more accurately reflect the Fund's actual risk level.

Related Party Transactions

National Bank Investments Inc. (the "manager") is the manager and promoter of the ETF. Accordingly, it is entitled to receive, in exchange for the services that it provides to the ETF, management fees paid to it by the ETF (see "Management Fees" below).

From time to time, the manager may, on behalf of the ETF, carry out transactions or sign agreements to involve certain persons or companies related to it, to the extent that these transactions or agreements are, in its opinion, in the interest of the ETF. The description of the transactions or agreements between the ETF and a related party is provided in this section.

Members of the manager's group may earn fees or spreads in connection with services provided to, or transactions with, the NBI ETF, including in connection with brokerage and derivatives transactions.

Trustee

The manager has retained the services of Natcan Trust Company to serve as trustee for the ETF and has retained the services of National Bank Trust to serve as portfolio manager.

Designated Broker

The manager has signed an agreement with National Bank Financial Inc. ("NBF"), a company affiliated with NBI, under which NBF will serve as a designated broker for the ETF. The designated broker agreement signed with NBF is in keeping with market conditions.

Brokerage Fees

The ETF may pay broker's commissions at market rates to a corporation affiliated with National Bank Investments Inc. The brokerage fees paid by the ETF for the period are as follows:

Transactions between the NBI Funds and the ETF were carried out in the normal course of business. The portfolio manager for these Funds is National Bank Trust Inc.

As at June 30, 2024, the Multi Asset Class Basket Private Pool held approximately 1.38% ownership of the redeemable units outstanding of the ETF. Transactions between the Multi Asset Class Basket Private Pool and the ETF were carried out in the normal course of business. The portfolio manager for this Fund is National Bank Trust Inc.

As at June 30, 2024, the NBI Exclusive Income Pooled Fund held approximately 2.02% ownership of the redeemable units outstanding of the ETF. Transactions between the NBI Exclusive Income Pooled Fund and the ETF were carried out in the normal course of business. The portfolio manager for this Fund is National Bank Trust Inc.

Management Fees

The management fee is payable to the ETF manager in consideration of the services that the manager provides to the ETF in its capacity as manager, such as managing the day-to-day business and affairs of the FTF


The ETF pays an annual management fee of 0.60% to the ETF manager for its management services. The fees are calculated based on a percentage of the ETF's daily net asset value before applicable taxes and are paid on a monthly basis. The management fees primarily covers investment management and general administration services.

Past Performance

The performance of the ETF, presented below and calculated as at December 31 of each year, is based on the net asset value of the ETF. It assumes that all distributions made in the periods shown were reinvested in additional units of the ETF. These returns do not take into account sales, redemption charges, distributions, or optional charges that would have reduced returns. Past performance of an ETF does not necessarily indicate how it will perform in the future.
