Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

For the six-month period ended June 30, 2023, the NBI Global Balanced Growth Fund's Advisor Series units returned 11.34% compared to 8.04% for the Fund's blended benchmark. The broad-based indices, the Morningstar® Developed Markets Large-Mid Cap Index (CAD), the Morningstar® Canada Large-Mid Index (CAD) and the Morningstar® Canada Liquid Bond Index (CAD), returned 12.29%, 6.00% and 2.48% respectively. Unlike the indices, the Fund's performance is calculated after fees and expenses. Please see the *Past Performance* section for the returns of all of the Fund's series, which may vary mainly because of fees and expenses.

Certain series of the Fund, as applicable, may make distributions at a rate determined by the manager. This rate may change from time to time. If the aggregate amount of distributions in such series exceeds the portion of net income and net realized capital gains allocated to such series, the excess will constitute a return of capital. The manager does not believe that the return of capital distributions made by such series of the Fund have a meaningful impact on the Fund's ability to implement its investment strategy or to fulfill its investment objective.

The Fund's net asset value rose by 20.25% over the period, from \$272,746 as at December 31, 2022, to \$327,988 as at June 30, 2023.

The increase stemmed mainly from unit purchases by investors in the Fund and market fluctuations.

It was an eventful first half in global capital markets. The first months of the year were characterized by strong performance from risk assets and rising risk-free rates as inflation generally surprised to the upside. In March, the collapse of regional U.S. bank SVB sent a shudder through U.S. financial markets briefly igniting a contagion among non-systematically important financial institutions. While the Fed moved quickly to stem this volatility, risk assets underperformed notably, and risk-free rates dropped. The balance of the half was marked by a gradual return of rates and spreads to pre-SVB levels. Ongoing strength in activity data and robust inflation saw terminal rates trend higher across most developed markets.

U.S. equities registered positive gains during the first half of the year, despite headwinds from increasingly restrictive monetary policy. The momentum was driven primarily by a strong economy, vigorous job market, and developments on the global macro front which continue to drive foreign funds into the perceived safety of American assets.

International equities continued to gain ground during the first half of the year as the eurozone economy gradually emerged from a mild winter recession between the fourth quarter of 2022 and the first quarter of 2023. Eurozone stocks responded accordingly, despite increasingly tight monetary policy by the European Central Bank, which remains preoccupied with stubborn inflation data. Japanese stocks performed particularly well. The Nikkei touched a 33-year high of 33,700 yen in June.

Under these circumstances, the Fund outperformed its benchmark.

Value added came mainly from security selection. Top individual contributors to relative performance during the period were Meta Platforms, Amazon.com and Adobe. On the other hand, top detractors were NVIDIA (not owned), Danaher and AMGEN.

The bond portfolio benefitted from its significant overweight to local Emerging Market rates as well as U.S. Agency MBS. It also benefitted from an overweight to the European periphery and a preference for EUR-denominated financial credit. Partially offsetting these factors was a large negative contribution from active yield curve and duration positioning in developed markets. An underweight to U.S. duration and an overweight to UK duration were the most significant sources of negative alpha for the period.

Recent Developments

There were several notable changes in the active risk profile of the bond portfolio in H1. Most notably, a move from slightly underweight to slightly overweight topline duration. By market, the portfolio moved overweight USD and NZD denominated duration and covered an underweight in JPY rate. Partially offsetting these additions were reductions in European and Mexican duration. In credit space, positioning shifted between neutral and slightly overweight aggregate beta while maintain a preference for EUR-denominated European financial credit. As of the end of H1, the fund was neutral duration overall with overweights in local emerging markets as well as New Zealand duration. Offsetting these overweights, the fund is underweight European and U.S. duration. The fund is positioning for steeper curve in the UK and Europe and a flatter curve in Japan. The fund is overweight peripheral European government debt as well as U.S. agency MBS. Lastly, in the credit space the fund is roughly neutral beta with a preference for EUR-denominated assets, particularly financials and REITs.

The U.S. economy is sending mixed signals with momentum diverging across various elements of the economy—manufacturing vs. services, better labour market balance vs. stubborn inflation, etc. The persistently sticky inflation will likely force the Fed's hand to hike interest rates by at least another 25 basis points. We continue to see risks stemming from tighter credit conditions, higher interest rates, and elevated inflation as skewed to the downside.

That said, investors remain hopeful regarding future productivity increases stemming from AI and related sectors. The recent congressional deal to raise the U.S. debt ceiling and defer further negotiations until after the next election, without material spending cuts created certainty on the fiscal front. Messaging from the U.S. monetary policy authority regarding the country's economic prospects remains bullish. FOMC members are telegraphing two further rate hikes later this year.

An easing, though still tense, global macro environment—as evidenced by a recent visit by U.S. Secretary of the Treasury Janet Yellen to China, and easier rhetoric emanating before the NATO summit in Vilnius—provided hope of further momentum going forward. A pause in the Federal Reserve's interest rate hike cycle, which eased competitive pressures on international central banks seeking to attract fund flows, will also help.

On May 1, 2023, the Fund's independent review committee (the "IRC") was increased to four members when Stéphanie Raymond-Bougie was appointed as an IRC member.

Related Party Transactions

National Bank of Canada ("the Bank") and its affiliated companies' roles and responsibilities related to the Fund are as follows:

Trustee, Custodian, and Registrar

Natcan Trust Company ("NTC"), a direct or indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank, is the Fund's trustee. In this capacity, it is the legal owner of the Fund's investments.

NTC acts as registrar for the Fund's securities and the names of securityholders. NTC also acts as the Fund's custodian. The fees for NTC's custodial services are based on the standard rates in effect at NTC

Agent for securities lending transactions

NTC acts as the agent for securities lending transactions acts on behalf of the Fund in administering securities lending transactions entered into by the Fund. NTC is an affiliate of the Manager.

Fund Manager

The Fund is managed by National Bank Investments Inc. ("NBII"), which is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank. Therefore, NBII provides or ensures the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund's current operations, including investment consulting, the arrangement of brokerage contracts for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, bookkeeping and other administrative services required by the Fund.

The Manager pays the operating expenses of the Fund other than its "Fund costs" (defined below) (the "variable operating expenses"), in exchange for the Fund's payment to the Manager of annual fixed-rate administration fees with respect to each series of the Fund.

The administration fees are equal to a specified percentage of the net asset value of each series of the Fund, calculated and paid in the same manner as the Fund's management fees. The variable operating expenses payable by the Manager include, but are not limited to: transfer agency and recordkeeping costs; custodial costs; accounting and valuation fees; audit fees and legal fees; costs of preparing and distributing financial reports, simplified prospectuses, annual information forms, Fund Facts, continuous disclosure material and other securityholder communications; and costs of trustee services relating to registered tax plans, as applicable.

In addition to administration fees, the Fund shall also pay certain Fund costs, namely: taxes (including, but not limited to, GST/HST and income taxes); costs of compliance with any changes to existing governmental or regulatory requirements introduced after August 1, 2013; costs of compliance with any new governmental or regulatory requirements, including any new fees introduced after August 1, 2013; interest and borrowing costs; costs related to external services that were not commonly charged in the Canadian mutual fund industry as at August 1, 2013; Independent Review Committee costs, including compensation paid to IRC members, travel expenses, insurance premiums and costs associated with their continuing education; and variable operating expenses incurred outside of the normal course of business of the Fund.

The Manager may, from time to time and at its sole discretion, decide to absorb a portion of a series' management fees, administration fees or Fund costs.

As described under the heading *Management Fees*, the Fund pays annual management fees to NBII as consideration for its services.

Portfolio Manager

The Manager has appointed National Bank Trust Inc. ("NBT"), an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank, as the portfolio manager for the Fund. A flat fee is payable annually to NBT for its management services.

Distribution and Dealer Compensation

NBII acts as principal distributor for the Fund. In this capacity, NBII buys, sells and swaps securities through external registered representatives. Fund securities are also offered by National Bank Financial Inc. (including its division National Bank Direct Brokerage), CABN Investments (a division of NBII) and other affiliated entities. Brokers may receive, depending on the distributed series, a monthly commission representing a percentage of the average daily value of the securities held by their clients.

Brokerage Fees

The Fund may pay broker's commissions at market rates to a corporation affiliated with NBII. The brokerage fees paid by the Fund for the period are as follows:

Holdings

As at June 30, 2023, National Bank Investments Inc. held 16,148.62 Fund securities for a value of \$158,016.06, which represented close to 47.9789% of the net asset value of the Fund at that date. Transactions between National Bank Investments Inc. and the Fund were carried out in the normal course of business and at the Fund's net asset value as at the transaction date.

Registered Plan Trust Services

NTC receives a fixed amount per registered account for services provided as trustee for registered plans.

Administrative and Operating Services

The provision of certain services was delegated by the Fund Manager, NBII, to National Bank Trust Inc. ("NBT"), a wholly-owned indirect subsidiary of the Bank. These include accounting, reporting and portfolio valuation services. The fees incurred for these services are paid to NBT by the Fund manager.

Management Fees

The Fund pays annual management fees to the Fund manager for its management services. As the Fund invests in underlying funds, the fees and expenses payable in connection with the management of the underlying funds are in addition to those payable by the Fund. However, the Fund manager makes sure that the Fund does not pay any management (or operating) fees that, to a reasonable person, would duplicate a fee payable by the underlying fund for the same service.

The fees are calculated based on a percentage of the Fund's daily net asset value before applicable taxes and are paid on a monthly basis. Under the *Distribution* heading, expenses include the broker's compensation consisting of the maximum annual trailer fees and sales commissions paid to brokers. Under the *Other* heading, the fees relate mainly to investment management, investment advisory services, general administration and profit. The breakdown of major services provided in consideration of the management fees, expressed as an approximate percentage of the management fees is as follows:


Past Performance

The higher a Fund's portfolio turnover rate in an accounting period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the accounting period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the accounting period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a Fund.
