Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

The NBI Canadian Equity Fund's investment objective is to achieve long-term capital growth. The Fund invests directly or indirectly in a portfolio comprised mainly of equity securities of large-capitalization Canadian issuers.

The portfolio manager analyzes stocks through a valuation approach of "growth at a reasonable price" with a long-term investment horizon. Based on fundamental analysis, the portfolio manager identifies companies with above average growth prospects and below average risk. Securities held in the portfolio are common and/or preferred shares of large-capitalization companies that are industry leaders, have strong management, a good earnings track record and reasonable financial leverage. The fund may invest up to 49% of its assets in securities of foreign issuers.

Risks

Results of Operations

For the twelve-month period ended December 31, 2022, the NBI Canadian Equity Fund's Investor Series units returned -13.30% compared to -5.84% for the Fund's benchmark, the S&P/TSX Capped Composite Index (CAD). Unlike the benchmark, the Fund's performance is calculated after fees and expenses. Please see the *Past Performance* section for the returns of all of the Fund's series, which may vary mainly because of fees and expenses.

Certain series of the Fund, as applicable, may make distributions at a rate determined by the manager. This rate may change from time to time. If the aggregate amount of distributions in such series exceeds the portion of net income and net realized capital gains allocated to such series, the excess will constitute a return of capital. The manager does not believe that the return of capital distributions made by such series of the Fund have a meaningful impact on the Fund's ability to implement its investment strategy or to fulfill its investment objective.

The Fund's net asset value dropped by 17.71% over the period, from \$948.07 million as at December 31, 2021 to \$780.19 million as at December 31, 2022.

The decline stemmed mainly from market fluctuations and withdrawals from the Fund by other NBI Funds.

The conflict in Ukraine, rapidly rising commodity prices, inflationary pressures and rising interest rates to quell those pressures were all factors that contributed to the weakness in most equity markets.

The unusual shortage of available labour is unique to this cycle and is contributing to a more resilient labour market, which makes a central banker's job more challenging in the fight against inflation.

While both bond and stock markets had a positive fourth quarter, central banks continued their campaign of increasing interest rates to catch up with the inflation train.

Overall for the 2022 year, the S&P/TSX Composite provided a return of -5.8%, with strong returns from the Energy sector.

Energy, which usually underperforms in a weak economic and market environment, outperformed meaningfully this time mainly due to Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

Year-to-date, the top performers in the S&P/TSX Composite Index were Turquoise Hill, Tourmaline Oil, and Enerplus, while the worst performers include Hut 8 mining, Bausch Health, and Shopify.

Under these circumstances, the Fund underperformed its benchmark.

The main detractor to performance was our stock selection and underweight position in the Energy sector.

The top individual contributors to performance in the portfolio were Uni Select, Restaurant Brands, and Intact Financial.

The top individual detractors to performance in the portfolio were Shopify, Brookfield Asset Management and Bank of Nova Scotia.

Recent Developments

For the 2022 year, we exited our positions Nutrien, Lifeworks, Recipe Unlimited Corp., Uni-Select Inc., PepsiCo Inc., Booking Holdings Inc., Diageo, Alibaba Group Holdings, Chubb Limited, and Tencent Holdings Itd

We exited our position in Nutrien, which benefitted from the rocketing price of potash following the invasion of Ukraine. Potash prices are well above their marginal cost of production, which we believe is unsustainable, and we were concerned by the numerous management changes in the last two years.

We exited LifeWorks following the announcement of the takeover by Telus Health, and redeployed funds into undervalued companies with better expected returns.

We initiated new positions in Definiti Financial and TC Energy.

We believe Definity Financial, the recently demutualized P&C insurance company, has many attributes to do well in this industry. Definity operates across Canada (with a dominant portion of its premiums from Ontario), is #7 in size with approximately 5% market share, but is a stone throw away from #4.

TC Energy is a leading North American energy infrastructure operator with over 70 years of history. It has a dominant and integrated natural gas network that connects markets in from Canada, the U.S. and down to Mexico, with three core businesses—predominately Natural Gas Pipelines, Liquids Pipelines and Power and Storage.

Compared to the index, the Fund is most overweight in Information Technology and Industrials.

The Fund is most underweight in the Energy and Financials sectors.

The outlook for financial markets includes a combination of fundamental and valuation factors. Looking at valuations first, the farther out the time horizon, the greater the correlation between the current valuation and market returns. For example, the 10-year U.S. equity market returns are correlated with current measures of valuation by over 80%. Current valuations suggest roughly 4% return for the U.S. stock market, although it would be closer to 8% for other markets given their more favourable valuations. This is by no means an exact science as the small, non-correlated portion can throw returns projections off by a considerable amount and there is obviously some variability around the average numbers, but it is a good starting point for any discussion about future returns. Long-term returns for bonds are a bit easier to calculate as high-quality bonds will essentially earn their yield-to-maturity.

Economic fundamentals are a notoriously tricky set of factors to use as a guide for future return estimates, especially the farther out one looks. For the current business cycle, inflation pressures have appeared to peak—the rate of change is now much lower over monthly time frames vs. longer time frames, such as six months or one year. What is difficult to predict is how fast or how far inflation will decline. The unusual shortage of available labour is unique to this cycle and is contributing to a more resilient labour market, which makes a central banker's job more challenging.

What we do know is that inflation and labour markets are lagging indicators, and, with long leading indicators still in recessionary territory, we expect that it will eventually translate into declining wage pressures. We also know that monetary policy has become less stimulative and, depending on how you measure it, even restrictive. In fact, inverted yield curves, such as the one we have now, are typically reliable signals that central bank policy stances are restrictive.

Overall, the economic fundamentals are pointing to a headwind for equity markets in the near term. Given that the stock market is a leading indicator in and of itself, some of these economic headwinds are already priced into markets. What investors have to decide is whether this margin of safety is enough. Have markets adequately priced in the potentially more challenging environment ahead? We would argue that to some extent they have but there is possibly more to go. This may provide good buying opportunities for long-term investors like us, and for this reason, we continue to watch for investment prospects at better entry points.

On April 30, 2022, the Fund's independent review committee (the "IRC") was reduced to three members when Robert Martin resigned as IRC member. On May 1, 2022, the Fund's IRC was increased to four members when Line Deslandes was appointed as IRC member. However, on September 30, 2022, the Fund's IRC was reduced to three members when Line Deslandes resigned as IRC member.

On May 20, 2022, NBI discontinued the purchase offering of deferred sales charge and low sales charge purchase options for all new investments, including purchases made through systematic plans in all Canadian jurisdictions. Investors who purchased units under these sales charge options will continue to be subject to the redemption fee schedules under which they were purchased.

Related Party Transactions

National Bank of Canada ("the Bank") and its affiliated companies' roles and responsibilities related to the Fund are as follows:

Fund Manager

The Fund is managed by National Bank Investments Inc. ("NBII"), which is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank. Therefore, NBII provides or ensures the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund's current operations, including investment consulting, the arrangement of brokerage contracts for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, bookkeeping and other administrative services required by the Fund.

The Manager pays the operating expenses of the Fund other than its "Fund costs" (defined below) (the "variable operating expenses"), in exchange for the Fund's payment to the Manager of annual fixed-rate administration fees with respect to each series of the Fund.

The administration fees are equal to a specified percentage of the net asset value of each series of the Fund, calculated and paid in the same manner as the Fund's management fees. The variable operating expenses payable by the Manager include, but are not limited to: transfer agency and recordkeeping costs; custodial costs; accounting and valuation fees; audit fees and legal fees; costs of preparing and distributing financial reports, simplified prospectuses, annual information forms, Fund Facts, continuous disclosure material and other securityholder communications; and costs of trustee services relating to registered tax plans, as applicable.

In addition to administration fees, the Fund shall also pay certain Fund costs, namely: taxes (including, but not limited to, GST/HST and income taxes); costs of compliance with any changes to existing governmental or regulatory requirements introduced after August 1, 2013; costs of compliance with any new governmental or regulatory requirements, including any new fees introduced after August 1, 2013; interest and borrowing costs; costs related to external services that were not commonly charged in the Canadian mutual fund industry as at August 1, 2013; Independent Review Committee costs, including compensation paid to IRC members, travel expenses, insurance premiums and costs associated with their continuing education; and variable operating expenses incurred outside of the normal course of business of the Fund.

The Manager may, from time to time and at its sole discretion, decide to absorb a portion of a series' management fees, administration fees or Fund costs.

As described under the heading *Management Fees*, the Fund pays annual management fees to NBII as consideration for its services.

Distribution and Dealer Compensation

NBII acts as principal distributor for the Fund. In this capacity, NBII buys, sells and swaps securities through Bank branches and the National Bank Investments Advisory Service in Canadian provinces and territories, and through external registered representatives. Fund securities are also offered by National Bank Financial Inc. (including its division National Bank Direct Brokerage), CABN Investments (a division of NBII) and other affiliated entities. Brokers may receive, depending on the distributed series, a monthly commission representing a percentage of the average daily value of the securities held by their clients.

Brokerage Fees

The Fund may pay broker's commissions at market rates to a corporation affiliated with NBII. The brokerage fees paid by the Fund for the period are as follows:

Holdings

As at December 31, 2022, National Bank Investments Inc. held 794.07 Fund securities for a value of \$8,025.14, which represented close to 0.0011% of the net asset value of the Fund at that date. Transactions between National Bank Investments Inc. and the Fund were carried out in the normal course of business and at the Fund's net asset value as at the transaction date.

Independent Review Committee Approvals and Recommendations

The Fund followed the standing instructions of its Independent Review Committee with respect to one or more of the following transactions:

- a) Purchasing or holding the securities of a related issuer, in particular, those of National Bank of Canada;
- Investing in the securities of an issuer when an entity related to the manager acts as an underwriter for the placement or at any time during the 6o-day period after the end of the placement;
- Purchasing or selling securities to another investment fund managed by the manager or a company in the same group;
- d) Purchasing or selling debt securities on the secondary market, through related brokers that are main brokers in the Canadian debt securities market (in accordance with an exemption received from the Canadian Securities Administrators);
- e) Entering into foreign exchange transactions (including both spot transactions and forward transactions) with National Bank of Canada.

The manager has implemented policies and procedures to make sure that the conditions applicable to each of the above transactions are met. The applicable standing instructions require that these transactions be carried out in accordance with NBI policies, which specify, in particular, that investment decisions pertaining to these related party transactions must be made free from any influence by an entity related to NBI and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to NBI. Furthermore, the investment decisions must represent the business judgment of the securities advisor, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interest of the Fund and must achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

Registered Plan Trust Services

NTC receives a fixed amount per registered account for services provided as trustee for registered plans.

Administrative and Operating Services

The provision of certain services was delegated by the Fund manager, NBII, to National Bank Trust Inc. ("NBT"), a wholly-owned indirect subsidiary of the Bank. These include accounting, reporting and portfolio valuation services. The fees incurred for these services are paid to NBT by the Fund manager.

Management Fees

The Fund pays annual management fees to the Fund manager for its management services. The fees are calculated based on a percentage of the Fund's daily net asset value before applicable taxes and are paid on a monthly basis. Under the *Distribution* heading, expenses include the broker's compensation consisting of the maximum annual trailer fees and sales commissions paid to brokers. Under the *Other* heading, the fees relate mainly to investment management, investment advisory services, general administration and profit. The breakdown of major services provided in consideration of the management fees, expressed as an approximate percentage of the management fees is as follows:


Annual Returns


