## **Management Discussion of Fund Performance**

#### **Investment Objective and Strategies**

The Meritage Growth Plus Income Portfolio's investment objective seeks to achieve high current income and long-term capital appreciation by investing primarily in a diverse mix of fixed income and equity mutual funds.

The portfolio manager's target weighting for this Portfolio is 10-30% of net assets invested in Canadian and global fixed income securities and 70-90% of net assets invested in Canadian and global equity. This weighting may be reviewed and adjusted based on economic and market conditions. The portfolio manager may, in its sole discretion, select the underlying funds, allocate assets to the underlying funds, change the percentage holding of any underlying fund, remove any underlying fund or add other underlying funds. The Portfolio may also invest in mutual funds that hold small-cap stocks.

#### Risks

The global investment risk of the Portfolio remains as described in the simplified prospectus or any amendments thereto and Fund Facts.

#### **Results of Operations**

For the twelve-month period ended December 31, 2022, the Meritage Growth Plus Income Portfolio's Advisor Series units returned -7.67% compared to -7.70% for the Portfolio's blended benchmark. The broadbased index, the Morningstar Canada Large-Mid Index (CAD), returned -5.43%. Unlike the indices, the Portfolio's performance is calculated after fees and expenses. Please see the *Past Performance* section for the returns of all of the Portfolio's series, which may vary mainly because of fees and expenses.

The Portfolio's net asset value dropped by 10.91% over the period, from \$85.87 million as at December 31, 2021 to \$76.50 million as at December 31, 2022.

The decline stemmed mainly from market fluctuations.

With the Russian invasion of Ukraine, record inflation, and potential recession on the horizon; it's fair to say that 2022 has proven to be challenging on many fronts. For investors, this context has resulted in declines for stocks and bonds in the first half of the year, followed by six months of ups and downs with no clear direction.

In this context of uncertainty and rising rates, global equities have performed similarly to traditional Canadian bonds in 2022, although for fixed income, this represents their worst annual performance in history. In terms of leadership, Canadian equities did significantly better than their peers, supported in part by generally high commodity prices. On the other hand, the environment was more difficult in emerging markets, held back by slowing global growth, containment in China, a strong U.S. dollar, and increasingly restrictive monetary policies.

Within fixed income, segments with longer duration suffered the most, a direct consequence of the substantial rate hikes delivered by most central banks.

For their part, Canadian preferred shares had a tough volatile year, an environment not seen since the first quarter of 2020. Rising rates and redemptions of preferred shares were not enough to compensate for the deterioration of the credit environment, particularly for hybrids and Limited Recourse Capital Notes (LRCN).

Within commodities, despite a wild rise following the announcement of the Russian invasion of Ukraine, the price of a barrel of oil ultimately closed in 2022 only slightly higher, slowed by increasingly weak economic growth prospects. For their part, gold prices also ended close to where they started in 2022 despite wild fluctuations.

Finally, like most currencies, the Canadian dollar depreciated sharply against the U.S. dollar amid heightened uncertainty.

Given this context, the Meritage Growth Plus Income Portfolio was beaten by its blended benchmark over the period. Within the Canadian equity segment, the RBC Canadian Dividend Fund was nearly neutral toward the Portfolio's overall return during the period. The Canadian fixed income component, particularly the TD Canadian Core Plus Bond Fund and the CI Canadian Bond Fund, drained value from the Portfolio's overall return over the period. In similar fashion, the global equity category's return for the Portfolio was hindered by the Capital Group Global Equity Fund, however, the EdgePoint Global Portfolio was nearly neutral.

#### **Recent Developments**

On October 27, 2022, changes were made to the Portfolio in order to optimize it. Given this context, the AGF American Growth Fund was added to the Portfolio and the weightings of the underlying funds, namely the Beutel Goodman Canadian Equity Fund, BMO Dividend Fund, and the RBC Canadian Dividend Fund within the Portfolio were reduced, as were the EdgePoint Global Portfolio and the Capital Group Global Equity Fund.

On April 30, 2022, the Fund's independent review committee (the "IRC") was reduced to three members when Robert Martin resigned as IRC member. On May 1, 2022, the Fund's IRC was increased to four members when Line Deslandes was appointed as IRC member. However, on September 30, 2022, the Fund's IRC was reduced to three members when Line Deslandes resigned as IRC member.

On May 20, 2022, NBI discontinued the purchase offering of deferred sales charge and low sales charge purchase options for all new investments, including purchases made through systematic plans in all Canadian jurisdictions. Investors who purchased units under these sales charge options will continue to be subject to the redemption fee schedules under which they were purchased.

The year 2023 should see a sustained slowdown in inflationary pressures, prompting central banks to pause their interest rate hike cycle by the second quarter. Meanwhile, growth figures are likely to begin to slow further as the lagged effects of the large rate hikes work their way through the real economy. With this environment comes significant risks of recession, which in turn could ultimately force central banks to set the stage for potential interest rate cuts later in the year.

With earnings under pressure, the coming year should therefore see a spread created in favour of fixed-income securities over equities, as suggested by the manager's quantitative model. For the time being, the manager still favours a slightly shorter duration considering the risk that the Fed's continued combative rhetoric will lead long rates to revisit their recent highs, but an opportunity to increase duration should present itself during the year. Within equities, the environment looks more challenging for emerging markets than in North America, while the manager's outlook favours more defensive strategies.

This scenario comes with a level of uncertainty that remains unusually high. For instance, a much faster-than-expected slowdown in inflation would represent the most optimistic scenario, if it prompts central banks to stop – and even reverse – their rate hike cycle earlier than expected, thereby reducing the likelihood of a recession. That said, an important risk factor remains excessive monetary tightening by a Federal Reserve that cannot afford to underestimate once again the persistence of inflationary pressures. One thing is certain: an important success factor in 2023 will be the ability to remain nimble in a constantly changing environment.

# **Related Party Transactions**

National Bank of Canada ("the Bank") and its affiliated companies' roles and responsibilities related to the Portfolio are as follows:

#### Trustee, Custodian and Registrar

Natcan Trust Company ("NTC"), a direct or indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank, is the Portfolio's trustee. In this capacity, it is the legal owner of the Portfolio's investments.

NTC also acts as the Portfolio's custodian, registrar and transfer agent. The Manager pays NTC for its services as custodian based on the assets held by the Portfolio. In addition, a flat fee per transaction is paid to NTC. With respect to the registrar and transfer agent services for the Portfolio, a fixed annual amount is paid to NTC by the Manager.

#### Agent for securities lending transactions

NTC acts as the agent for securities lending transactions acts on behalf of the Portfolio in administering securities lending transactions entered into by the Portfolio. NTC is an affiliate of the Manager.

#### Manager

As described in the *Management Fees* section, the Portfolio pays annual management fees to National Bank Investments Inc. (the "Manager") in consideration for management services. The management fees cover mainly the Manager's costs of managing the Portfolio's investments. The Manager is an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of National Bank of Canada (the "Bank").

Since October 29, 2013, the Manager pays the operating expenses of the Portfolio other than its "portfolio costs" (defined below) (the "variable operating expenses"), in exchange for the Portfolio's payment to the Manager of annual fixed-rate administration fees with respect to each series of the Portfolio.

The administration fees are equal to a specified percentage of the net asset value of each series of the Portfolio, calculated and paid in the same manner as the Portfolio's management fees. The variable operating expenses payable by the Manager include, but are not limited to: transfer agency and recordkeeping costs; custodial costs; accounting and valuation fees; audit fees and legal fees; costs of preparing and distributing financial reports, simplified prospectuses, annual information forms, fund facts, continuous disclosure material and other securityholder communications; and costs of trustee services relating to registered tax plans, as applicable.

In addition to administration fees, the Portfolio shall also pay certain portfolio costs, namely: taxes (including, but not limited to, GST/HST and income taxes); costs of compliance with any changes to existing governmental or regulatory requirements introduced after August 1, 2013; costs of compliance with any new governmental or regulatory requirements, including any new fees introduced after August 1, 2013; interest and borrowing costs; costs related to external services that were not commonly charged in the Canadian mutual fund industry as at August 1, 2013; Independent Review Committee costs, including compensation paid to IRC members, travel expenses, insurance premiums and costs associated with their continuing education; and variable operating expenses incurred outside of the normal course of business of the Meritage Portfolios.

The Manager may, from time to time and at its sole discretion, decide to absorb a portion of a series' management fees, administration fees or Portfolio costs.

## Portfolio Manager

The Manager has appointed National Bank Trust Inc. ("NBT"), an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank, as the portfolio manager for the Portfolio. A flat fee is payable annually to NBT for its management services.

# **Distribution and Dealer Compensation**

Portfolio securities are offered by National Bank Direct Brokerage (a division of National Bank Financial Inc., an indirect wholly owned subsidiary of the Bank), CABN Investments (a division of National Bank Investments Inc.), National Bank Financial Inc. and other affiliated entities. Each month, brokers receive a commission representing a percentage of the average daily value of the securities held by their clients. In addition, when Advisor Series securities are purchased, brokers usually receive a commission, which varies depending on the sales charge option chosen at the time of investment.

#### **Brokerage Fees**

NBT carries out the Portfolio transactions in the underlying funds through National Bank Direct Brokerage (a division of National Bank Financial Inc., an indirect wholly owned subsidiary of the Bank). Each month, the Manager pays a flat fee for each transaction carried out in the underlying fund securities.

#### **Holdings**

As at December 31, 2022, National Bank Investments Inc. held 226.67 Portfolio securities for a value of \$1,985.59, which represented close to than 0.0017% of the net asset value of the Portfolio at that date. Transactions between National Bank Investments Inc. and the Portfolio were carried out in the normal course of business and at the Portfolio's net asset value as at the transaction date.

#### **Administrative and Operating Services**

NBT provides the Portfolio with certain services, including accounting, reporting and portfolio valuation services. The costs incurred for these services are paid by the Manager to NBT.

## **Management Fees**

The Portfolio pays annual management fees to the Manager in consideration for management, portfolio advisory and administrative services and facilities required by the Portfolio in its day-to-day operations. As the Portfolio invests in underlying funds, the fees and expenses payable in connection with the management of the underlying funds are in addition to those payable by the Portfolio. However, the Manager makes sure that the Portfolio does not pay any management (or operating) fees that, to a reasonable person, would duplicate a fee payable by the underlying fund for the same service.

The management fees are calculated as a fixed percentage of the Portfolio's daily net asset value, are accrued on a daily basis and are paid monthly. The Portfolio is required to pay applicable taxes on the management fees.

Under the heading *Distribution*, expenses include the broker's compensation consisting of the maximum annual trailer fees and sales commissions paid to brokers. Under the heading *Other*, the fees relate mainly to investment management, investment advisory services, general administration and profit. The breakdown of the main services received in consideration for the management fees, as a percentage of the management fees collected from the Portfolio, is as follows:


## **Past Performance**



#### **Index Descriptions**

The **Morningstar® Canada Large-Mid Index** measures the performance of Canadian stock exchanges by targeting 90% of shares, based on their order of importance in terms of market capitalization.

The Morningstar® Canada Liquid Bond Index offers diversified exposure to federal debt securities guaranteed by the federal government, to provincial debt securities guaranteed by the provincial government and to corporate debt securities denominated in Canadian dollars in order to maintain liquidity. Small issuances, issuances with limited terms and issuances with credit ratings lower than those of investment-grade securities are excluded from the index.

The Morningstar® Developed Markets Large-Mid Cap Index is a subset of large- and mid-cap stocks included in the Morningstar® Developed Markets Index, a broad-based index that represents 97% of the market capitalization of developped markets.
