Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Meritage Global Conservative Portfolio's investment objective is to achieve a steady rate of return and some long-term capital appreciation by investing primarily in a diverse mix of mutual funds that may include exchange-traded funds ("ETFs") that are global fixed income funds and global equity funds.

The target weighting for each asset class in which the Portfolio invests under normal market conditions is the following: 60%-80% of the net assets in global fixed income securities; and 20%-40% of the net assets in global equity securities. The portfolio manager may, in its sole discretion, review and adjust the target weighting of each asset class depending on economic and market conditions. The portfolio manager may, in its sole discretion, select the Underlying Funds, allocate assets to the Underlying Funds, change the percentage holding of any Underlying Fund, remove any Underlying Fund or add other Underlying Funds. Investments in Canadian fixed income and equity funds should not exceed approximately 45% of the net assets of the Portfolio. The Portfolio may also invest in Underlying Funds that hold shares of small cap corporations and or in Underlying Funds that hold emerging market fixed income and equity securities.

Risks

The Portfolio's risk level was modified from "low" to "low to medium" during the year. This change aims to more accurately reflect the Portfolio's actual risk level.

Results of Operations

For the twelve-month period ended December 31, 2025, the Meritage Global Conservative Portfolio's Advisor Series units returned 5.39% compared to 8.06% for the Portfolio's blended benchmark. The broad-based indices, the Morningstar® Canada Liquid Bond Index (CAD) and the Morningstar® Developed Markets Large-Mid Cap Index (CAD), returned 3.26% and 16.22% respectively. Unlike the indices, the Portfolio's performance is calculated after fees and expenses. Please see the *Past Performance* section for the returns of all of the Portfolio's series, which may vary mainly because of fees and expenses.

Certain series of the Portfolio, as applicable, may make distributions at a rate determined by the manager. This rate may change from time to time. If the aggregate amount of distributions in such series exceeds the portion of net income and net realized capital gains allocated to such series, the excess will constitute a return of capital. The manager does not believe that the return of capital distributions made by such series of the Portfolio have a meaningful impact on the Portfolio's ability to implement its investment strategy or to fulfill its investment objective.

The Portfolio's net asset value dropped by 6.50% over the period, from \$18.31 million as at December 31, 2024 to \$17.12 million as at December 31, 2025.

In 2025, the resilience of the global economy and the absence of a worrying rise in inflation enabled equity markets to maintain an upward trajectory, posting above-average gains for the third consecutive year.

More specifically, global equities (+22.9% for the MSCI ACWI) outperformed their historical average and far outpaced the Canadian bond universe (+2.4%). Unlike in 2024, stock market leadership in 2025 was firmly outside the United States. The S&P 500 (+17.9%) significantly underperformed the S&P/TSX (+31.7%), the MSCI EAFE (+31.9%) and the MSCI Emerging Markets (+34.4%). In Canada, the S&P/TSX was buoyed in part by the spectacular performance of gold miners amid a sharp rise in the price of gold (+62.5%).

In fixed income, risk appetite favored Canadian corporate bonds (+4.3%) over government bonds (+2.0%). The same was true in the United States, where high-yield bonds (+8.5%) outperformed Treasury bonds (+6.2%). Finally, the US dollar depreciated significantly (-9.4% for the DXY index) during the year, against a backdrop of new tariffs imposed by the Trump administration and deteriorating investor sentiment toward U.S. assets.

In this context, the Fund underperformed its benchmark. The AGF American Growth Fund brought the most value to the Portfolio during the period. The Sun Life MFS GL Growth Fund contributed the least value to the Portfolio's overall return over the period.

Recent Developments

On January 28, 2025, changes were made to the Portfolio in order to optimize it. Given this context, the RBC Global Bond Fund and the EdgePoint Global Portfolio Fund were removed, and the CI Canadian Bond Fund, the AGF American Growth Fund, the PH&N Overseas Equity Fund, and the Capital Group Global Equity Fund were reduced. This was replaced by an increase in the RP Strategic Income Plus Fund, the Manulife Strategic Income Fund, and the addition of the TD Canadian Core Plus Bond Fund, the Leith Wheeler Canadian Equity Fund, the NBI Canadian All Cap Equity Fund, the RBC Vision Canadian Equity Fund, the Sun Life MFS Global Growth Fund, the TD Global Equity Focused Fund, and the RBC Emerging Markets Equity Fund.

For 2026, the manager's baseline scenario forecasts sustained economic growth in 2026, supported by monetary easing and expansionary fiscal measures. However, risks remain, both on the downside and upside. On the negative side, a further deterioration in the labor market would be problematic, especially if the current dynamic of "low hiring and low layoffs" shifted toward more significant layoffs. On the positive side, higher-than-expected productivity gains from investments in artificial intelligence could support economic growth while containing inflationary pressures. However, with so many accommodative measures in place, any disappointment on the productivity front could reignite fears of economic overheating.

In this context, the manager maintains a moderately favorable stance on risk through an overweight position in equities relative to fixed income.

Within equities, the manager maintains an overweight position in Canadian and Emerging Market equities, reflecting strong relative momentum, positive earnings prospects, and a sector composition well suited to the current environment. Conversely, the manager is underweight in equities from the EAFE region, where earnings growth prospects are less favorable.

On January 28, 2025, the blended benchmark was modified to better reflect the categories of assets in which the Fund invests. The current blended benchmark is composed of the Morningstar® Canada Liquid Bond Index (CAD) (70%), the Morningstar® Developed Markets Large-Mid Cap Index (CAD) (22.5%) and the Morningstar® Canada Large-Mid Index (CAD) (7.5%). The previous blended benchmark was composed of the Bloomberg Global Aggregate Index (CAD Hedged) (75%) and the Morningstar® Developed Markets Large-Mid Cap Index (CAD) (25%). The current broad-based indices are the Morningstar® Canada Liquid Bond Index (CAD) and the Morningstar® Developed Markets Large-Mid Cap Index (CAD). The previous broad-based index was the Bloomberg Global Aggregate Index (CAD Hedged).

On or about May 14, 2025, National Bank Investments Inc. ("NBI") replaced National Bank Trust Inc. ("NBT") as portfolio manager of the Fund. The investment objectives of the Fund remain unchanged. This change has no impact on the sub-advisor currently making investment decisions for the Fund.

The Fund's risk level was modified from "low" to "low to medium" during the year. This change aims to more accurately reflect the Fund's actual risk level.

Related Party Transactions

National Bank of Canada ("the Bank") and its affiliated companies' roles and responsibilities related to the Portfolio are as follows:

Trustee, Custodian and Registrar

Natcan Trust Company ("NTC"), an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank, is the Portfolio's trustee. In this capacity, it is the legal owner of the Portfolio's investments.

NTC also acts as the Portfolio's custodian, registrar and transfer agent. The Manager pays NTC for its services as custodian based on the assets held by the Portfolio. In addition, a flat fee per transaction is paid to NTC. With respect to the registrar and transfer agent services for the Portfolio, a fixed annual amount is paid to NTC by the Manager.

Agent for securities lending transactions

NTC acts as the agent for securities lending transactions on behalf of the Portfolio in administering securities lending transactions entered into by the Portfolio. NTC is an affiliate of the Manager.

Manager

As described in the *Management Fees* section, the Portfolio pays annual management fees to National Bank Investments Inc. (the "Manager") in consideration for management services. The management fees cover mainly the Manager's costs of managing the Portfolio's investments. The Manager is an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of National Bank of Canada (the "Bank").

Since October 29, 2013, the Manager pays the operating expenses of the Portfolio other than its "portfolio costs" (defined below) (the "variable operating expenses"), in exchange for the Portfolio's payment to the Manager of annual fixed-rate administration fees with respect to each series of the Portfolio.

The administration fees are equal to a specified percentage of the net asset value of each series of the Portfolio, calculated and paid in the same manner as the Portfolio's management fees. The variable operating expenses payable by the Manager include, but are not limited to: transfer agency and recordkeeping costs; custodial costs; accounting and valuation fees; audit fees and legal fees; costs of preparing and distributing financial reports, simplified prospectuses, annual information forms, fund facts, continuous disclosure material and other securityholder communications; and costs of trustee services relating to registered tax plans, as applicable.

In addition to administration fees, the Portfolio shall also pay certain portfolio costs, namely: taxes (including, but not limited to, GST/HST and income taxes); costs of compliance with any changes to existing governmental or regulatory requirements introduced after August 1, 2013; costs of compliance with any new governmental or regulatory requirements, including any new fees introduced after August 1, 2013; interest and borrowing costs; costs related to external services that were not commonly charged in the Canadian mutual fund industry as at August 1, 2013; Independent Review Committee costs, including compensation paid to IRC members, travel expenses, insurance premiums and costs associated with their continuing education; and variable operating expenses incurred outside of the normal course of business of the Meritage Portfolios.

The Manager may, from time to time and at its sole discretion, decide to absorb a portion of a series' management fees, administration fees or Portfolio costs.

Portfolio Manager

The Manager has appointed National Bank Investments Inc. ("NBI"), an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank, as the portfolio manager for the Portfolio. NBI acts as both Manager and portfolio manager of the Portfolio.

Distribution and Dealer Compensation

Portfolio securities are offered by National Bank Direct Brokerage (a division of National Bank Financial Inc., an indirect wholly owned subsidiary of the Bank), National Bank Financial Inc. and other affiliated entities. Each month, brokers receive a commission representing a percentage of the average daily value of the securities held by their clients. In addition, when Advisor Series securities are purchased, brokers usually receive a commission, which varies depending on the sales charge option chosen at the time of investment.

Holdings

As at December 31, 2025, National Bank Investments Inc. held 182.61 Portfolio securities for a value of \$1,310.02, which represented close to 0.0121% of the net asset value of the Portfolio at that date. Transactions between National Bank Investments Inc. and the Portfolio were carried out in the normal course of business and at the Portfolio's net asset value as at the transaction date.

Administrative and Operating Services

NBT provides the Portfolio with certain services, including accounting, reporting and portfolio valuation services. The costs incurred for these services are paid by the Manager to NBT.

Management Fees

The Portfolio pays annual management fees to the Manager in consideration for management, portfolio advisory and administrative services and facilities required by the Portfolio in its day-to-day operations. As the Portfolio invests in underlying funds, the fees and expenses payable in connection with the management of the underlying funds are in addition to those payable by the Portfolio. However, the Manager makes sure that the Portfolio does not pay any management (or operating) fees that, to a reasonable person, would duplicate a fee payable by the underlying fund for the same service.

The management fees are calculated as a fixed percentage of the Portfolio's daily net asset value, are accrued on a daily basis and are paid monthly. The Portfolio is required to pay applicable taxes on the management fees.

Under the heading *Distribution*, expenses include the broker's compensation consisting of the maximum annual trailer fees and sales commissions paid to brokers. Under the heading *Other*, the fees relate mainly to investment management, investment advisory services, general administration and profit. The breakdown of the main services received in consideration for the management fees, as a percentage of the management fees collected from the Portfolio, is as follows:

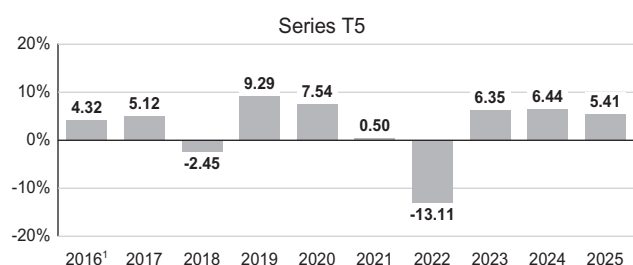
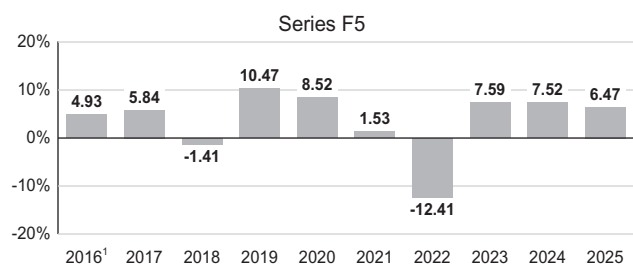

Past Performance

It assumes that all distributions made in the periods shown were reinvested in additional securities and does not take into account sales, redemption charges, distributions, or optional charges that would have reduced returns. Past performance of a series of the Portfolio does not necessarily indicate how it will perform in the future.

Annual Returns

Index Descriptions

The **Morningstar® Canada Liquid Bond Index** offers diversified exposure to federal debt securities guaranteed by the federal government, to provincial debt securities guaranteed by the provincial government and to corporate debt securities denominated in Canadian dollars in order to maintain liquidity. Small issuances, issuances with limited terms and issuances with credit ratings lower than those of investment-grade securities are excluded from the index.

The **Morningstar® Developed Markets Large-Mid Cap Index** is a subset of large- and mid-cap stocks included in the Morningstar® Developed Markets Index, a broad-based index that represents 97% of the market capitalization of developed markets.

The **Morningstar® Canada Large-Mid Index** measures the performance of Canadian stock exchanges by targeting 90% of shares, based on their order of importance in terms of market capitalization.

The benchmark was modified to better reflect the categories of assets in which the Portfolio invests. The information related to the previous benchmark is presented below.
